Sub: Case No-176/2008, Prior Environmental Clearance for Laterite, Iron Ore, Manganese Ore, Quartz and Clay Mine, Village-Kodamukur, Tehsil-Sihora, District-Jabalpur, mining lease area 17.008 ha. production capacity 61,000 TPA.

The case was discussed in 141st SEIAA meeting dtd. 11.07.2013 and it was recorded that.....

"It has been decided that from 01.04.2010, the prescribed TORs would be valid for a period of two years for submission of the EIA/EMP Reports, after public consultation where so required. This period will be extendable to the 3rd year, based on proper justification and approval of the EAC/SEAC, as the case may be. Thus, an outer limit of three years has been prescribed for the validity of TORs with effect from 01.04.2010.

In case of the proposals, which had been granted TORs prior to the issue of this O.M. the EIA/EMP reports should be submitted, after public consultation where so required, no later than four years from the date of the grant of the TORs, with primary data not older than three years".

It has been informed by the SEIAA office that following 23 cases were registered wherein as per above OM the time limit of 4 years has expired after issuing ToR, but PPs have not submitted final EIA Report in SEIAA Office as yet. As per EIA Notification 2006 PP should submit EIA Report to SEIAA Office and subsequently would be sent to SEAC Office for appraisal. Presently this procedure is in practice too.


The SEIAA Office has also examined and found that PPs have not applied to extend time limit for validity of TOR and as such the prescribed time limit is over. Hence, it has been decided that all these 23 cases are summarily rejected.

In view of above-mentioned fact, you are hereby informed that your case is summarily rejected.
