

Minutes of the 35th SEIAA Meeting held on 12th May, 2010

(A) Other Cases

1. Shri Ashwin Purendrasingh Chandel, 15, Sardar Patel Marg, Alirajpur, Jhabua M.P., Behadawa Dolomite mine 8.34 ha, 4000 TPA at Vill- Behadawa, Teh- Alirajpur, Distt-Jhabua M.P., **Case no.131/2008.**

The above case was sent back to SEAC as per the decision taken in 20th meeting of SEIAA held on 5/9/2009. But it has not been received by the Authority.

It was decided that the SEAC may be asked to send the case back to SEIAA after getting the requisit information from project proponent at the earliest.

2. Agrawal Mineral Process, Chhindwara M.P., Mines 5 Ha.Village-Gwari-wodona Teh-Sausar, Distt-Chhindwara, **Case no.6/2008.**

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

It was decided in the 16th meeting to get opinion of the Collector, Chhindwara regarding the compensation issue. A reply from the Distt.Collector has been received.

The Authority decided to accord the prior environmental clearance to the above project on the basis of the recommnedation of SEAC and the reply from the Distt. Collector.

3. Puranal Vishwakarma, Katni M.P., Bauxite, Laterite, fire clay mine in 12.97 ha. at Village Tharka, Katni -M.P. **Case no.39/2008.**

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

It was decided in the 22nd meeting of SEIAA to send it to the District Collector for the verification of the process followed for public hearing. The reply has been received from the Collector.

The Authority accepted the recommendation of SEAC and decided to accord prior environmental clearance to the above project.

4. Ganesh Vishwakarma, Jalpadevi Ward, Gautam Maholla, Katni M.P. Bauxite, Laterite, fireclay and yellow ochre mines, 27-35 ha. Village –Tikariya, Teh-Murwara, Distt.Katni-M.P. **Case no.60/2008.**

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

It was decided in the 22nd meeting of SEIAA to send it to the District Collector for the verification of the process followed for public hearing. The reply has been received from the Collector.

The Authority accepted the recommendation of SEAC and decided to accord prior environmental clearance to the above project.

5. Raghuvir Ferro Alloy Pvt Ltd, Industrial Area Urla, Raipur C H, Manganese ore mine 8.11 hact.1000TPR at vill-Jagantola, Teh-Baihar, Distt.Balaghat **Case no.175/2008**

The above case was rejected on the ground of non submission of Forest Deptt. NOC.

The project proponent has submitted a copy of the Forest Deptt. NOC.

The Authority after scrutinising the documents submitted observed that four of the five Khasras, fall within 250 m from forest boundary. The project proponent should be asked to produce a latest Forest Deptt. NOC for all the Khasra issued by the competent Authority.

It was decided to send the case back to SEAC for reconsideration on the above ground.

6. S N Sunderson Co., 1-Deshbandhu Gupta Road, Post Box No5713 New Delhi., Badari limestone & Dolomite 5.04 hact. at village –Badari Teh-Vijayraghgarh Distt-Katni **Case no.196/2008.**

It was decided in the 28th SEIAA meeting that DFO, Katni may be asked to send a latest Forest Deptt. NOC. Same has been received by the Authority.

The Authority accepted the recommendations of SEAC and decided to accord the prior environmental clearance to the above project.

7. M/s Lupin Ltd Industrial area, Mandideep, Raisen M.P. Proposed capacity enhancement and addition new products 198.202, New Industrial Area No.2, Mandideep Raisen M.P. **Case no.148/2008**

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

The project proponent was asked to submit an attested copy of the letter issued by Director, Industrial Health & Safety accepting the emergency plan prepared by the project proponent. The same has been submitted to the Authority by the project proponent.

The Authority accepted the recommendation of SEAC and decided to accord the prior environmental clearance to the above project.

8. Nilesh Upadhyay, S/o Shri Ramesh Chandra Upadhyay college road, Distt- Jhabua M.P., Lime stone mine 7.50 hact. at Vill- Kosdana, Teh- Gandhewani Distt- Dhar M.P **Case no.192/2008**

The above case was sent back to SEAC as per the decision taken in 20th meeting of SEIAA held on 05/09/2009. But it has not been received by the Authority.

It was decided that the SEAC may be asked to send the case back to SEIAA after getting the requisite information from project proponent at an earliest.

9. M/s Samdariya Builders Pvt. Ltd, 16, Sarafa Bazar, Distt-Jabalpur-M.P., Proposed shopping mall at civic centre Jabalpur-M.P. **Case no.441/2009 & 516/2010**

The project proponent of the above project was allowed withdrawal on the basis of the proposed built-up area being less than 20000 Sq.m. After a clarification from MoEF the proposed area comes out to be more than 20000 Sq.m. The Authority was informed that the proponent has again applied for the prior environmental clearance and the case is with SEAC for appraisal.

10. M/s DLF Ltd Indore M P, Integrated Township at village Sulakhedi and Mundla Bagh Teh. Sanwer, Distt. Indore M.P. **Case no.13/2008**

The above case was accorded prior environmental clearance in the 27th meeting of SEIAA. But after receipt of the memorandum issued by MoEF on 13/01/2010 the case was considered in the 32nd SEIAA meeting again.

It was decided to write to Distt. Collector, Indore and Commissioner Municipal Corp. Indore to verify whether the proposed project location lies within the area specified in MoEF's Memorandum dated 15/03/2010.

The letters to the Distt. Collector and the Commissioner, Municipal Corporation Indore, has already been written. Further decision in this regard may be taken after getting a reply from the above officers.

11. M/s Kamadigiri store crusher Udyog, Brij Kishore Sharma, Bhind M.P. Stone Quarry Lease 20,000 MTPA stone mine 43.0 ha., Vill-Dang, Teh-Gohad, Distt-Bhind M.P., **Case no. 161/2008**

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

The Authority while scrutinizing the documents observed that a written complaint was made to the District Collector by Shri Lokendra Singh and others on 7/1/2010.

12. M/s Kamta Nath Store crusher Prop.Nthuram Jatav, Bhind M.P., Stone Quarry Lease, 20,000 MTPA stone 42.63 ha.Vill-Dang Teh-Gohad, Distt.Bhind- M.P.
Case no. 160/2008

The above case was recommended by SEAC for grant of prior environmental clearance.

The Authority while scrutinizing the documents observed that a written complaint was made to the Distt. Collector by Shri Jatiram and other on 5/3/2010.

It is stated in the complaint that no.of temples are located on the various Khasras of the mining lease. The proposed blasting activity may be dangerous to the villagers and animals.

It was decided by the Authority to send the case back to SEAC for a detail report on this matter, and clarify whether the temples are listed monuments of Archeology Deptt. SEAC should also ensure whether the safety of the villagers and temples has been taken care of by the proponent in the EIA report.
