





1. **Case No. 5548/2017** - Prior Environmental Clearance for Manganese Ore Mine (Underground semi mechanized method) in an area of 6.264 ha. for expansion of production capacity from 10,000 TPA to 18,000 TPA at Khasra no. 16/1 at Village-Jagantola, Tehsil - Paraswada, District - Balaghat (MP). by M/s Hira Power and Steel Ltd, Executive Director , Khasra No. 51 1/1, 512/2, Urla Industrial Complex, Raipur, CG - 492003

1. This is a project pertaining to mining of Manganese Ore Mine in MLA of 6.264 ha. The activity is mentioned at S.No. 1 (a) of the Schedule of EIA Notification 2006 as amended from time to time. The project is reported to be at a distance of more than 10 km from National Park /Sanctuary etc. thus it is not attracted by the general conditions and falls under category 'B-1" by virtue of its location and mining lease area. The case was forwarded by SEIAA to SEAC for appraisal of EIA for environment clearance for the project. It was submitted that this is a proposed mine having valid lease period upto 03.11.2046 with expansion of production capacity from 10,000 TPA to 18,000 TPA. The Mining Plan has been approved by IBM, Jabalpur (Vide L.No. M.P /Balaghat/ Manganese/ MPLN / MOD - 33 /16-17/630, dtd 10.02.2017).
2. PP has produced an order of the Mineral Resources Deptt. GoMP dtd. 03.09.2015 in which after hearing the case the State Govt. has established that action be taken according to the latest circular 19-5-2015/12/1 dtd. 12.03.2015, which states that "all mining leases granted before the commencement of the Mines & Minerals (Development & Regulation) Amendment Ordinance 2015 shall be deemed to have been granted for a period of fifty years.








## Minutes of the 520<sup>th</sup> Meeting of SEIAA dated. 15.01.2019

3. SEAC in its 334th SEAC meeting dtd 30.11.2018 has recommended the case with 54 special conditions for issuance of EC.
4. PP has submitted Clarification during SEAC meeting presentation regarding no requirement of NOC from commissioner level forest committee for 250 meter from forest boundary. The Mining Lease area is not touching the forest boundary from any side and it is surrounded by ML area of Krishna Mining & Trading Syndicate (62.58ha) from 3 sides & one side it is adjacent to Mining Lease area of Mr. I. Patric Dhanaraaj, hence there is no necessity of NOC from commissioner level forest committee for 250 meter from forest boundary. Furthermore in letter of Govt. of Madhya Pradesh, Forest Department which is addressed to MS MPSEIAA clearly written that "It is an old Mining Lease hence, no requirement of NOC Certificate". Govt. of M.P. Forest division, Ministry, Vallabh Bhavan, Bhopal, vide letter no. F-5/16/81/10-3, Bhopal dated 07.10.2002 also stated that provision for NOC from commissioner level forest committee for 250 meter from forest boundary is not applicable in case the Mining Lease is sanctioned prior to above stated date i.e. 07.10.2002 and our mine is sanctioned before this date.
5. It was noted that as per DFO L.No. 4177 Balaghat, dtd. 30.12.2011, the National Park/Sanctuary is not located within 10 Km., radius from the mining site. Hence, the General Conditions are not attracted.
6. It was noted that the water requirement is 9.0 KLD (1.6 KLD for Dust Suppression + 2 KLD for Green Belt + 1.4 KLD for Drilling + 4 KLD for Domestic), which shall be met from Mine sump & Borewell.
7. The proposed plantation programme was examined and it was found that 8000 sapling of tree species shall be planted within five years in the mining lease area. PP has recently planted 2000 saplings in the September 2018 as reported.
8. Earlier prior Environmental Clearance was granted by MoEF & CC (Letter No. J – 11015/212/2006 – IA.II (M), Dt. 27/09/2007 and again prior Environmental Clearance was granted by MPSEIAA Case No. (413/2009) Letter No. 64/EPCO-SEIAA/12, Dt. 18/04/2012
9. PP has now applied for Prior Environmental Clearance for expansion of production capacity from 10,000 TPA to 18,000 TPA without any change in the technology. Earlier EC was granted for the expansion from 8,000 TPA to 10,000 TPA with change in technology from open cast to underground mine by manual/semi mechanized method in an area of 6.264 ha and EC was issued vide letter no. 64/EPCO-SEIAA/12 Dated 18/04/2012. PP requested committee further that as per clause No. 7(ii) (a) of MOEF notification No. S. O. 3518 (E) dated 23rd Nov. 2016 they may be categorized in B2 category (without following entire environmental clearance process such as EIA report and public hearing) since proposed change does not result in any adverse impact on





environment and whereas, the change in quantity of existing projects having environment clearance within existing area may be exempted from entire environmental clearance since there is no additional pollution load beyond the earlier approved threshold limit envisaged.


10. The provisions made in referred notification dated 23/11/2016 were placed before the committee which reads as follows:

*" All applications seeking prior environmental clearance for expansion with increase in the production capacity beyond the capacity for which prior environmental clearance has been granted under this notification or with increase in either lease area or production capacity in the case of mining projects or for the modernization of an existing unit with increase in the total production capacity beyond the threshold limit prescribed in the Schedule to this notification through change in process and or technology or involving a change in the product mix shall be made in Form I and they shall be considered by the concerned Expert Appraisal Committee or State Level Expert Appraisal Committee within sixty days, who will decide on the due diligence necessary including preparation of Environmental Impact Assessment and public consultations and the application shall be appraised accordingly for grant of environmental clearance".*

11. After considering the MoEF&CC notification issued vide SO 3518(E) dated 23/11/2016, 7(ii) (a) in EIA Notification, 2006 recommends that PP has to carryout EIA study to ascertain the increase in pollution load however and in place of public hearing as per EIA Notification, 2006, a notice may be given in local two news papers inviting suggestions/objections for this expansion project through Regional Officer, MP Pollution Control Board, Jabalpur and same should be addressed through EMP with EIA report. PP further submitted that they have started collecting the baseline data from March, 2017. It's being a case of Manganese Ore Mine and falls under B-1 category committee recommended to issue standard TOR. ToR issued on dated 14.06.2017 valid upto 23.05.2020.
12. It was also noted that the Public Hearing was carried out on 24.06.2010 at Mine Parisar Village Jagantola, under the Chairmanship of ADM, Balaghat. The major comments of applicants during public hearing are water for irrigation, access on approach road, Controlled blasting, employment of local people, construction & maintenance of existing / approach road connecting the mine & main road, Plantation on road side, regular health check-up of mine workers & water sprinkling to suppress the dust emission.
13. PP has submitted compliance report of earlier prior EC certified by MoEF &CC Regional Office, Bhopal (dtd. 29.06.2018). As per the report the implementation of environmental safeguards are found satisfactory and some compliance needs improvement which are in progress and has been advised to take care for conditions like environmental management, green belt development, road maintenance, It is decided that PP should ensure the implementation of the observations of MOEF & CC RO, Bhopal report dtd 29.06.2018.






**After detailed discussions and perusal of recommendations of 334th SEAC meeting dtd 30.11.2018, it was decided to accept the recommendation of SEAC for grant of prior EC to the project subject to the following specific conditions:**

- I. Before commencing any mining activity fencing shall be carried out all around the lease area. Proper watch and ward arrangements should be made with installation of signage at 4 corners of lease area to avoid any untoward incident involving public and animals by the PP.
- II. The proponent shall ensure to study the impact of UG mining on the aquifers and ground water flow system especially in the context of underground mining and the likely subsidence in the study area.
- III. The ventilation fan, exhaust, safety equipment's for workers, cap lamps are provided to underground workers alongwith lighting in underground tunnel for sufficient illumination should be provided.
- IV. The ores and minerals shall be covered by tarpaulin or by such other means when transported out of the mine by road. The vehicles shall not be overloaded.
- V. Mineral handling shall be provided with either adequate number of high efficiency dust extraction system or water injection system. Loading and unloading areas including all the transfer should be properly maintained and operated.
- VI. Drilling shall be wet operated to avoid fugitive dust emissions
- VII. Subsidence shall be monitored closely and if subsidence is found exceeding the permitted limits than adequate compensated shall be levied on the mine operator.
- VIII. Ground vibrations due to blasting operations should comply with the DGMS standards.
- IX. Utilization of sub-grade mineral has to be ensured as far as possible.
- X. All garland drains shall be connected to settling tanks through settling pits and settled water shall be used for dust suppression, green belt development and beneficiation plant. Regular de-silting of drains and pits should be carried out.
- XI. Settling tanks and pits with proper pitching shall be provided for settling time. The accumulated silt (containing silica also) shall be used for back filling and till than store in RCC lined tank.
- XII. Regular monitoring of subsidence movement on the surface over & around the working area & impact on natural drainage pattern, water bodies, vegetation, structure, road & surrounding shall be continued till mining ceases completely. Incase any high rate of subsidence movement appropriate effective corrective measures shall be taken to avoid loss of life and material. Cracks, if found, shall be effectively plugged with suitable material.
- XIII. PP shall demarcate a barrier zone of 7.5 m as no mining zone in the periphery of mining lease area and develop a green belt. Three row plantations shall be carried out in the greenbelt area in current year with proper watering arrangement.







- XIV. The mining operation shall be restricted to above ground water table and in no case it should intersect the ground water table. In case of working below the ground water table approval of the Central Ground Water Board shall be obtained.
- XV. PP shall ensure to plant total 8000 saplings within five years. PP will plant 3 years old 1600 trees samplings of suitable indigenous fast grow tree species (neem, amla, peepal, drumstick etc.) in barrier zone/no mining zone along the transportation route initially within six month. Plantation programme as mentioned in EIA/EMP and presented during presentation in SEIAA & SEAC shall be followed in content and spirit.
- XVI. PP shall ensure to construct and maintain Pakka approach road from the mine site. Plantation will be carried out on both side of the approach road. PP shall also ensure maintenance of existing pakka road in consultation with competent authority.
- XVII. The over burden and waste will be stacked for five years and then simultaneously backfilled in the mined out area where plantation will be raised on it.
- XVIII. No overburden will be dumped outside the mine lease area.
- XIX. Regular air & water quality monitoring shall be carried out by PP before discharging it into the nearby agriculture fields from authorized laboratory in consultation with Regional Officer, MPPCB.
- XX. PP shall ensure generation of employment opportunities nearby Village on priority bases.
- XXI. Payments of wages to the workers shall be done in consonance with the provisions in the labour laws.
- XXII. Proper infrastructure with shelter, drinking water, toilet and first-aid facilities shall be provided for the laborers. A provision should be made to construct a pakka rest shelter along with toilet and drinking water facility.
- XXIII. PP should also carry out regular sprinkling in the mining lease area to arrest dust emission from mining activities affecting the nearby agriculture fields
- XXIV. Mining shall be limited to the area as shown in surface plan and as per the approved mining scheme.
- XXV. PP shall handle the rejects and waste material obtained from total excavation as mentioned in EIA/EMP and approved mining plan.
- XXVI. PP shall ensure the proper water supply arrangements for plantation especially in summer season.
- XXVII. PP shall ensure proper implementation of plantation, dust suppression, construction of approach road and maintenance of existing pakka road and tube well, retaining wall as part of Environmental Management Plan. Additional budget provision shall be made as part of EMP.
- XXVIII. PP must ensure implementation of the following activities with separate budget provision of Rs.5.06 lakhs under CSR.
- Upgrade Primary Schools and Aganbadi Kendra at Jagantola & Rupjhar.
  - Agriculture improvement camps for youth and farmenrs.

**All the modification to the above activities can be made with the permission of the district administration and need based activity for the development of nearby villages shall be implemented by PP in consultation with the District Collector and Grampanchayat.**

XXIX. PP should ensure to submit half yearly compliance report and CSR activity report with photographs of plantation in MP-SEIAA.
