Minutes of the 13th SEIAA Meeting held on 8th May, 2009

The 13th meeting of the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority was convened on 8th May, 2009 at 11.30 A M at the Authority's office in M.P. Pollution Control Building, Paryavaran Parisar, Bhopal chaired by Shri Subroto Banerji.

(I) Case recommended by SEAC for Environmental Clearance.

1. M/s Bright star Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd, Indore- M.P., Residential Township project at Jatkhedi, Hoshangabad Road, Bhopal-M.P. (Group Housing & Commercial Area Deve.) Case No. 43/2008.

The above case was sent back to SEAC for reconsideration on the ground of verification of land ownership in the name of the project proponent as per the revenue record.

The project proponent submitted the photocopies of all the rin pustikas duly notarized. The total land of 83.36 acres stands in the name of the project proponent as per the rin pustika

While scrutinizing the other details submitted by the project proponent it came to the notice of the SEIAA that water demand for the project is 616 KLD while CGWB in its no objection certificate has permitted to draw only 153 KLD of water from the two existing tube wells. This shows that there is a deficit of (616-153) 463 KLD of water. Project proponent has not produced any commitment from Bhopal Municipal Corporation regarding supply of water to the project.

Hence SEIAA decided to send the case back to SEAC to further clarify from the project proponent as to how the above deficit of water will be met. Specific recommendations from SEAC, after procuring information from the project proponent are expected.

2. PGH International Pvt Ltd., Shopping Mall cum multiplex Raslakhedi, Karond –Bhanpur bye-pass road. Bhopal-M.P. case no.12/2008.

The above project was sent back to SEAC for reconsideration on the point of supply of water by the Bhopal Municipal Corporation to the project proponent during construction and operation phase.

During construction phase the project proponent has committed to use treated water from an existing STP of the same group located near the site. A letter issued by Executive Engineer, Bhopal Municipal Corporation produced by the project proponent states, that it will be possible to supply water to the project after Narmada water availability in the city.

SEIAA accepted the above explanation of the project proponent and decided to accord environmental clearance to the project.

3. M/s S.R. Ferro Alloys, Aditya Avenue, M.P. Nagar, Zone II, Bhopal, Kajali Dongari Manganese mine 30.86 ha. at Village Kajali, Dongari, Talluka-Jhabua, Distt- Jhabua- M.P. case no 112/2008.

The above case was sent back to SEAC for reconsideration on the grounds of possible threat to human health and contamination of ground water.

SEAC asked the Regional officer of M.P. Pollution Control Board, Indore to send their report on these two points. The report of the Regional office, Indore reveals that there are no reported cases of silicosis in the area and no evidences of ground water contamination are found due to the mining activity.

On the basis of the above report SEIAA decided to accord environmental clearance to the project.
